We are closely following the Zika virus outbreaks and travel implications. Below are a few points about the virus as well as current Zika travel notices from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control):

- Spread through mosquito bites
- Symptoms: Fever, rash, joint pain, red eyes
- Usually mild, lasting a few days to a week 80% of cases will not be diagnosed
- Began in Brazil
- Poor pregnancy outcomes. We encourage anyone travelling to or from affected countries to schedule a Travel Clinic appointment to further discuss your particular travel concerns.
